Mineola approves 192-unit rental complex

The Village of Mineola approved a special use permit last week for the development of a 192-residence apartment complex on the site of a former elementary school on Searing Avenue.

The plan from Dallas-based Mill Creek Residential calls for the construction of two four-story apartment buildings at the 2-acre site of the former Corpus Christi Elementary School located less than a mile from the Mineola Long Island Rail Road station.

The Corpus Christi Parish will use the proceeds from the sales of the former school and an adjacent property to pay off debt owed to the Diocese of Rockville Centre, according to a written statement.

Mill Creek, which has been renting its new 275-residence apartment complex nearby on Old Country, still needs to subdivide the school building lot before it begins construction on the new roject, slated to start by the summer. The company is also applying to the Nassau County Industrial Development Agency for tax breaks on the Searing Avenue development.

"This approval is a win-win-win for not just Mill Creek, Corpus Christi Church and the Diocese of Rockville Centre, but also for the residents of the Village of Mineola," attorney Chris Coschignano, a partner of Sahn Ward Coschignano, who represented Mill Creek, said in the statement. "The project represents a redevelopment of an unutilized property that will help to attract people to the village who will have easy access to the LIRR. It is a smartgrowth project that is helping communities like Mineola transform and revitalize their downtowns."

Sahn Ward attorneys John Farrell and Nicholas Cappadora assisted Coschignano in representing the developer.
